



# Neighborhood Homework House

*a decade of service to Azusa's most precious resource*

Two teachers begin after-school tutoring for 6 elementary school children on 9<sup>th</sup> Street.

**1997**

Homework House rents apartment to serve as a tutoring center. Summer Splash is launched.

**1998**

Four families open their apartments to allow 20 neighborhood children to receive tutoring.

Homework House expands to daily tutoring for 80 neighborhood students with the help of 35 volunteer tutors.

\*25 volunteers  
\*1 employee  
\*3 days a week

Summer Splash expands to the 6<sup>th</sup> Street neighborhood, to the delight of 35 young residents.

\*First Spring Fundraiser is attended by over 100 friends from the community.  
\*Four Homework House teens are hired as Summer Splash interns.  
\* With the addition of a tutoring session exclusively for high school students, Homework House is now serving students from Kindergarten through High School.

The Neighborhood Teen Project is launched to prepare 40 neighborhood teens for careers and college.

**2004**

6<sup>th</sup> Street Homework House opens its doors to 40 neighborhood children for tutoring, adding 20 new volunteers to serve as academic coaches and encouragers to our new students.

**2005**

**2006**

\*140 children and their families are served with daily neighborhood-based programs in two communities. Over 100 trained volunteers with 3 fulltime and 2 halftime staff, implement the vision.

\*Homework House parents join together to form an Advisory Board sparking parental involvement as volunteers and as participants in workshops ranging from parenting to computer literacy.
